I was able to travel to Colorado Springs and USAFA earlier this month and had a very informative meeting with Mark Hille, the CEO of the National AOG. As a result, I want to share a few discussion items with you.

The first one involves the SUPT's and the Commandant's efforts to return the mission of the Academy to that of the "WARRIOR ETHOS." This is not an easy "fix" but the Academy leadership is attempting to do exactly that.

Many of you have heard that the Wing is now wearing Dress Blues for football games – without blouses in appropriate weather. (Personally, I consider that a plus factor.)

It is true, the SUPT is no longer making attendance at football games mandatory for the entire Wing (with the exception of Parent's Weekend and inter-service games). Instead, he is requiring only TWO GROUPS to attend, and left it optional for the other two groups. Mark explained that there are some thoughtful reasons behind this decision, though some grads may see it differently. The SUPT wants cadets to support all 27 Academy intercollegiate teams, in addition to Football. In place of those football games, cadets must attend other sporting events as a squadron. Stay tuned!

Mark Hille and I also discussed the lack of being able to get better information from the AOG with regards to our local grads in MN who sign up for the events that our Chapter has planned. Part of this "problem" has to do with privacy concerns throughout our nation. The Academy cannot release contact data to our Chapter without expressed consent from the grad themselves. We can get around this sometimes with an acknowledgment by the grad that when they sign up for an event, they are authorizing the release of their email address or contact information to our Chapter, in case of changes or confirmation of our events.

In the future, this may also be accomplished through the new AFA "Portal" that the AOG is trying to establish and make more usable. Mark admitted that more work is being put into the portal to make it more "user friendly." We must be patient for a while longer.

Our Chapter along with the MN Parents Group, has a great relationship with the AOG and we want to keep it that way. Let me know if any of you reading this have questions, comments or suggestions and I will pursue the info or answers with Mark and his staff.



On a separate note, I want to share some thoughts about our Chapter's Scholarship Program. This is a new venture that we instituted this past spring. We awarded two \$500 scholarships to two separate dependents of our graduate members. Simply stated, we wish to increase the scholarships in number and in the values of each award. Many of you have donated to our Chapter in the past, but have stopped doing so because we have not pressed any of you for donations. We currently have no real need for additional fund raising to carry on our Chapter aims and goals.

This will change if we want to improve this scholarship opportunity. For this reason, we will be soliciting donations in the future for scholarships. We would like to increase the value to \$5000 per recipient and offer as many as we can each year. To do this, we have some requests: First, if any of you wish to donate to this program, all you have to do is contact out Treasurer, Rick Knoll, '65, and identify your donation for the Scholarship Program and that is where the money will be held until awarded. Additionally, if any of you work for a company that would love to donate any amount of dollars to this endeavor, please let me know. I would be delighted to meet with you and the appropriate person to make that happen. Also, if any of are aware of a local Foundation that would like to support education for military families, again, let me know and I will pursue that option as well.

We should do all we can to make this a viable program.

I hope you find it interesting for your own personal use and for possible gifts for family grads – especially for multiple generations of family grads...

This might be something that each local grad might be interested in purchasing for your own use or as a gift to a graduating child or grandchild. The cost for a single framed crest is \$75; for a double framed crest, \$100; a triple crest, \$125. Size of the single crest is 8x10, framed 11x14.

"SOME CHRISTMAS THOUGHTS" Tom Wilson, '61

With Christmas right around the corner, and with no opportunity to produce another Newsletter until the new year, I think it appropriate to share some lessons I have learned over the years about some of the holiday and Christmas meanings. We all have probably sung the "Twelve Days of Christmas" carol. But do you know the real meaning and background of this famous carol??? Allow me, please.

The eight maids a milking were the eight beatitudes.

Nine ladies dancing were nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

The ten lords a leaping were the Ten Commandments.

Eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful apostles.

Twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed. Now you know!!! But do you know the synopsis of the symbolism of gold, frankincense and myrrh???

For Jesus: Gold is a symbol of royalty and represents the kingship of Christ; frankincense is used in the worship of God and points to the divinity of Christ; myrrh is a burial oil and symbolizes the humanity of Christ, especially His death and resurrection.

For us: Gold (resplendent) is the wisdom of Christ that should shine forth from us; frankincense is the prayer that we offer to God each day, especially the Eucharist; and myrrh is the daily self-sacrifice that we do for God.
